The Scientific Council of the Faculty of Pharmacy of the University of Lisbon, under the proposal of the Scientific Committee of the Master Programme in Biopharmaceutical Sciences, publishes the 2025/2026 Call for Applications:

Master Programme in Biopharmaceutical Sciences 2025/2026

The 2-year Master Course in Biopharmaceutical Sciences is organized in 4 semesters.

This Course enlarges the classical concept of biopharmaceutical sciences by providing scientific, multidisciplinary background on the discovery phase of the drug development process, at advanced level. The programme includes the study of molecular mechanisms of disease, potential therapeutic targets and therapeutic strategies, while motivating students to equate and solve problems. Aimed at preparing creative and independent investigators and knowledgeable professionals, the Course will encourage the debate of recent topics and the use of advanced experimental technologies. These objectives will further engage the contribution of teaching staff from other institutions, pharmaceutical industry, and biotechs.

In this openness perspective, the student will have the option to obtain credits in other related scientific areas within the University of Lisbon, not restricted to the Faculty of Pharmacy, stimulating mobility. The Course will benefit from the close interaction with R&D units in academia and outside, including renowned international institutions.

The structure of the Course in elective modules, except for the mandatory units of Scientific Writing and Communication and Experimental Design of Research and Innovation, allows students to follow an individualized path, according to their objectives. Learning will be, in this context, clearly directed towards solid scientific training, under tutorial guidance, in accordance with the guidelines of the Bologna Process, based on the vast scientific-pedagogical experience of the teaching staff.

1. Number of vacancies¹

1.1 National and European Union Member-States students: 27

1.2 International students: 5

2. Definition of an International Student

2.1 The International Student is the student who does not have Portuguese nationality (article 3 of Decree-Law no. 62/2018, of August 6, which amended and republished Decree-Law no. 36/2014).

- **2.2** The conditions of the previous paragraph do not apply to:
 - a) Nationals of a member state of the European Union;
 - b) Family members of Portuguese nationals or nationals of a Member State of the European Union, regardless of their nationality²;
 - c) Those who are not nationals of a Member State of the European Union and are not covered by the previous paragraph, but who have been legally resident in Portugal for more than two years, uninterruptedly, on January 1st of the year in which they intend to enter higher education, as well as their children who are legally resident with them;
 - d) Those who are beneficiaries, on January 1st of the year in which they intend to enter higher education, of equal rights and duties status granted under an international treaty between the Portuguese State and the State of which they are a national;
 - e) Those who apply to enter higher education through the special access and entry regimes regulated by Decree-Law no. 64-A/2023, of July 31.

¹ Vacancies are automatically reclaimed between stages and types of entry if they are not filled in full.

² Family members are Portuguese nationals or nationals of a member state of the European Union, regardless of their nationality:

a) The spouse of a citizen of the European Union;

b) The partner with whom a citizen of the European Union lives in a de facto union, constituted under the terms of the law, or with whom the citizen has a permanent relationship duly certified by the competent authority of the member state where they reside;

c) A direct descendant under the age of 21 or who is a dependent of a citizen of the European Union, as well as a spouse or partner within the meaning of the previous point;

d) The dependent direct ascendant of a citizen of the European Union, as well as that of the spouse or partner within the meaning of point (ii).

3. Teaching Language

- **3.1** Should a non-Portuguese speaking applicant be admitted, classes are taught in English; the course contents and materials are all in English.
- **3.2** It is recommended that all students have an adequate knowledge of the English language for the pursuit of their studies.

4. Admission Requirements

The candidates should be:

- a) Holders of an undergraduate degree: BSc degree or legal equivalent in the areas of Health Sciences, Life Sciences or Biotechnology;
- b) Holders of a foreign higher education academic degree awarded after accomplishing a 1st cycle of studies, structured according to the principles of the Bologna Process by a State that has adhered to this Process, in the areas of Health Sciences, Life Sciences or Biotechnology;
- Holders of a foreign higher education degree in the areas of Health Sciences, Life Sciences or Biotechnology recognized as complying with the objectives of the Bsc degree by the Scientific Board;
- d) Holders of an academic, scientific or professional curriculum that is recognized by the Scientific Council as attesting the ability to carry out this cycle of studies.

5. Application

- **5.1** The application is exclusively online submitted through the application platform of the Faculty of Pharmacy, available on www.ff.ulisboa.pt. A careful reading of the **Application Handbook** is advised.
- **5.2** Applications are only considered when supported by the following documents:
 - a) Document proving possession of a bachelor's or master's degree, indicating the final grade³;
 - b) Curriculum vitae duly updated, including documents proving the publications/activities mentioned in the CV.

³ If the applicant has not yet completed their degree or does not possess the degree completion document at the time of application, they must specify the course they are currently completing or have already completed. As part of the application process, they must provide a Transcript of Records or an Achievement Certificate. Additionally, the Motivation Letter should state that they are in the process of completing their degree and include the expected completion date. A Statement of Honour confirming the degree completion must also be submitted.

The completion of the degree and the corresponding classification are key factors in the applicant evaluation process. The absence of these elements may result in exclusion. The Selection Board of the Study Cycle may choose to rank and select applicants without a completed degree alongside those from the 2nd call. If admitted, enrollment will always be conditional upon the submission of the degree completion certificate.

- c) A motivation letter setting out the reasons for applying to this course;
- d) Copy of the Identification Card, Citizen Card, or Passport, for personal data validation, and one passport photo in colors.
- e) <u>International Student Statement</u>, in case of international students.
- f) <u>Statement of Honour</u>, that the applicant has not yet completed the degree or does not have the degree completion document at the time of application.
- g) Other elements considered relevant by the candidate for the purposes of assessing the application.
- **5.3** Documents proving the applicant's qualifications must be issued by the competent authority of the country where they were obtained and must be legalized if not issued in Portugal. Legalization must be completed by a Portuguese consular officer or through the Hague Apostille in the country of origin. If the documents are not in Portuguese, English, or Spanish, they must be translated into one of these languages.
- **5.4** All documents must be attached, in *PDF* format, on the application platform. If any of the mandatory documents are divided into several files, they must be compiled into a single ZIP file.

6. Selection and Ranking Criteria

- **6.1** Applicants will be selected by the Selection Board of the Study Cycle, taking into account the following parameters:
 - a) Academic degree classification and adequacy to the programme;
 - b) Curricular evaluation;
 - c) Motivation Letter and, if necessary, an interview with the applicants may be carried out by the Scientific Committee of the course.
- **6.2** If the number of applicants is lower than the vacancies, all applicants who gather the access conditions defined in the no. 4 will be placed in alphabetical order.

7. Deadlines

1st Call

Application period – 1 April to 06 June 2025

Publication of results - until 20 June 2025

Registration and enrolment - 25 to 26 June 2025

Possible placement of reserves applicants: until June 30, 2025.

2nd Call

Application period – 1 July to 24 July 2025

Publication of results – until 31 July 2025

Registration and enrolment – 07 to 08 August 2025

Possible placement of reserves applicants: until August 13, 2025

3rd Call

Application period - 15 August to 31 August 2025

Publication of results - until 5 September 2025

Registration and enrolment - 11 to 12 September 2025

Possible placement of reserves applicants: until September 16, 2025

Appeal period - up to 10 working days after publication of results

Beginning of classes - September 2025

8. Application and Tuition Fees

- **8.1** The application fee is 75€ (seventy-five euros), non-refundable, even if the candidate is excluded or not selected.
- **8.2** The annual tuition fees for <u>national students</u> for the 2025/2026 academic year will be fixed by the General Council of the University of Lisbon in:
 - a) 1.500€ for the 1st year of the course (curricular programme);
 - b) 1.750€ for the 2nd year of the course.
- **8.3** The annual tuition fees for <u>international students</u> for the 2025/2026 academic year will be fixed by the General Council of the University of Lisbon in:
 - a) 3.250€ for the 1st year of the course (curricular programme);
 - b) 3.750€ for the 2nd year of the course.
- **8.4** Students must pay the first instalment of tuition fees, school insurance and the enrolment or registration fee at the time of enrolment.
- **8.5** Deadlines and instalments will be specified at the beginning of the academic year.

9. Schedule:

The Course runs from Monday until Friday, 17.00 p.m. to 20.00 p.m. Classes will be held at the Faculty of Pharmacy, University of Lisbon. The research project leading to the

dissertation will develop in internal and/or external laboratories, both in Portugal and abroad, recognized by the Scientific Committee of the Master Course.

10. Final Provisions

- **10.1** In accordance with the legal provisions in force, admitted applicants may apply for the equivalence of their previous academic qualifications.
- **10.2** Should the master course fail to reach the minimum number of students required to run, the application fee will be refunded to the applicant.
